Fireside Creek Project to Provide Year-Round Housing for Winter Park Workers

As part of the Town's long-term commitment to creating a community where we can all live and work year-round, the Fireside Creek Project is gaining momentum. The current proposal by the Town and its development partner, Winter Park Partners, includes 66 units with both two-bedroom and one-bedroom apartments. The Town intends to offer deed-restricted workforce housing and require long-term leases for residents who earn 80-120% of the area median income.

That means Fireside Creek will provide an affordable option for our local professional workforce. Even when they earn a good salary, many cannot find housing because options are limited or simply not available. This makes it difficult to fill positions such as medical professionals, police officers, educators, and other essential community service positions. Fireside Creek's deed-restricted workforce housing will fill a much-needed housing gap in our community.

This Town-sponsored project has been in the works since 2010, but it wasn't until recently that the Town was able to move forward with the development. The apartments will be built on the vacant lot located between Silverado II and Wolf Park to the east of Kings Crossing that is already zoned for multi-family residential development. As with any project that takes place on undeveloped land, Fireside Creek is subject to the Town's adopted development standards. Town Council saw this particular parcel and this particular project

as an opportunity to address a major need in our community. Rest assured, the Town is committed to ensuring that this project meets and exceeds all of the development standards from traffic to parking, landscaping to design, Fireside Creek will fit seamlessly with the neighborhood. And, just as importantly, it will add value for our entire community.




