Parking for Curbside Service

Some short-term parking zones have been added along Hwy 40 to aid with curbside service. Customers can pull into these areas to pick-up or drop-off food, gear and supplies without leaving their car. These parking zones will be available through the duration of the winter season. Parking zones are located in front of Cooper Creek, on each side of Wander's Way (in front of Epic Mountain Sports and Hideaway Brewery) and near Rollin' Street Bakery. **These are not official parking spots.**



Christmas Tree Cutting Procedures

If you're looking to cut down a Christmas tree this year, please be aware that procedures and permits to do so have changed. Permits can be obtained through the [Arapaho and Roosevelt National Forests](#), but tree cutting is only allowed in a few areas nearby.

Winter Lift service is in full swing! However, buses must operate at 50% capacity – please be patient and courteous. Masks are required for all riders over the age of 10. To help plan your trip, QR codes have been added to all stops along Main Street to track when the next bus is arriving – or download the Lift Rider app to see buses in real-time.
