Entering the Lottery

The Town holds a lottery for available apartments and rental units once a year. Lotteries for for-sale units occur as units become available.

How does the lottery work?

Residents can join the lottery during the open application period and will be assigned entries based on length of residency in the County, current place of residence, and current place of employment, as follows:

Draws given for **LENGTH** of residency in the County:

1 1-2 YEARS	3 6-9 YEARS
2 3-5 YEARS	4 10+ YEARS

Draws given for current place of **RESIDENCE**:

3 WINTER PARK/FRASER
2 WITHIN THE FRASER REC DISTRICT BOUNDARY
1 GRAND COUNTY

Draws given for current place of **EMPLOYMENT**:

3 WINTER PARK/FRASER
2 WITHIN THE FRASER REC DISTRICT BOUNDARY
1 GRAND COUNTY

EXAMPLE:

A person who lives in Tabernash, works in Winter Park and has lived in the County for 6 years would get:

$$2+3+3 = 8 \text{ DRAWS}$$

The annual lottery will create a priority list for all open units throughout the next year. Applicants who miss the annual lottery will only be considered if the priority list from the previous lottery is exhausted or a lottery is held for a for-sale unit.

When lottery applications open for either the annual rental lottery or for-sale units, the open application will be announced to the waitlist and posted on the Town's website.

Am I eligible for workforce housing?

Those who live in Grand County, work 32 hours a week or 1,200 hours a year in a job located within Winter Park or a job that predominately serves the residents of Winter Park are eligible for workforce housing.

Other Housing Resources

While Winter Park is actively working to increase the housing stock for the community's workforce, there are still fewer homes than there are people seeking housing. However, there are other resources available to those working and living in our mountain community and trying to make ends meet.
